Nevada

2006-07: Did not play due to a knee injury and was granted a sixth year of eligibility from the NCAA. **2005-06 Junior:** Played in 16 games and made eight starts before missing the rest of the season with a knee injury...had five games scoring in double figures, including a season-best 15 points at Oregon...led the team with a shooting percentage of .465...pulled down eight rebounds against Northern Colorado and against Northwestern Louisiana...recorded 13 steals, eight assists and three blocks on the year...hit better than 70 percent (36 of 51) from the free-throw line...third on the team in rebounding at 4.4 per game.



Purdue University

Originally from the San Francisco Bay Area, the 6-3 forward played two seasons for the Boilermakers from 2002-04...during those years, Purdue went 58-10, 26-6 in Big Ten play, won back-to-back Big Ten tournament titles, and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2003 and the Sweet 16 in 2004.

High School

At Berkeley High School, she was a finalist for McDonald's All-America honors after averaging 18.0 points and 15.0 rebounds per game her senior year...also earned all-conference and all-state honors as a junior racking up 15.0 ppg and 10 rpg and finished the year as an honorable mention All-American by Street & Smith's...led her team to state runner-up honors for the second straight year in 2000-01, losing in the title game of the CIF tournament to national champion Narbonne 47-45...received the Outstanding Sportsmanship Award at the 1999 Mark Curry Invitational Tournament and twice won the Mayor's Award of Excellence.

Born in August of 1984...parents are Ethel and Jerry Keys...has three younger brothers: Moses, Joshua and Isiaha...majoring in sociology...enjoys going to movies.
